

Matt Horning is a plant geneticist with the USDA Forest Service Pacific Northwest Region stationed on the Deschutes National Forest in Bend, Oregon. His primary responsibility is to provide guidance to land managers on the use of genetically appropriate plant materials in restoration activities. In cooperation with multiple collaborators, much of his work is focused on creating seed transfer guidelines for native grasses and shrubs planted on arid lands. Additionally Matt has expanded the scope of these efforts to include revegetation planning and implementation on highly disturbed sites. Through this work Matt has established extensive partnerships with a diverse array of agency, university, and NGO cooperators. Matt also consults and trains domestic and international natural resource specialists on numerous aspects of nursery, revegetation and reforestation practices.
