Tom Saladyga is an Assistant Professor of Geography at Concord University in Athens, West Virginia where he teaches courses in physical and environmental geography. He earned a Ph.D. in Geography from West Virginia University, an M.A. in Geography from West Chester University, and a B.S. in Geography from Penn State. His dissertation research examined the interactions between fire, climate, and land use in north-central Mongolia. Tom also has natural resource management experience with the National Park Service (Ozark National Scenic Riverways and the Eastern Rivers and Mountains Monitoring Network) and the Delaware Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control. Currently, his research is guided by an interest in understanding and applying socioecological thresholds to forest and fire management across the Central Appalachian region.

Alecea Standlee is Assistant Professor in Sociology at Concord University, having received her M.A. in Women's Studies from the University of Cincinnati and a Ph.D. in Sociology from Syracuse University. She teaches courses in social inequality, social institutions, theory and methods. Her current research examines the social and cultural implications of contemporary technology use in community culture, with a specific interest in experiences of inequality in digital spaces.
